Richard Meier is an unconventional architect with an apparent appreciation for uniqueness. The individuality of his designs is original and inspiring. The Douglas House in Harbor Springs, Michigan is an example of his creativity because it is built into the side of a cliff. The mostly-glass exterior is similar to the outer shell of my house in that there are two layers of wall. His other designs, such as the Jubilee Church in Rome, also have a style involving layers. While the arched layers on the outside of this church may be impractical for a residential structure, they show innovative ways to use layers in a building.
